TO: ALL RESIDENTS/PROPERTY OWNERS OF ISLAND VIEW

RE: OPERATION OF VEHICLES WITHIN THE VILLAGE

Further to our last Council Meeting, dated June 3rd, 2017; there have been numerous complaints with regard to unlawful operation of vehicles, including, but not limited to recreational vehicles. All vehicles, including golf carts, require the operator to have a minimum, valid, Class 7 Driver's License; i.e. Learner's License. This means they may not be driven by anyone under the age of 15. This is the law in Saskatchewan. Parents and guardians, this is your responsibility. If caught or reported, there is a minimum \$100.00 fine and the vehicle can be impounded by the R.C.M.P. at their discretion.

With regard to recreational vehicles, in particular; there may not be any more than the specified number of people per vehicle. Therefore, if a golf cart or other recreational vehicle is a 2 seater, there can be only two people in the vehicle. On many occasions, these vehicles have been seen throughout our village, driven by a child and loaded with other children, hanging off the sides and the back. This is extremely dangerous. On at least one occasion, children have tipped over a golf cart and had to be assisted by adults.

We would also like to remind everyone, once again, that **NO ONE** is to drive above the posted speed limits. There have been far too many people racing down our streets of late; and this includes children on recreational vehicles. For everyone's safety, please slow down.

We realize that summer in Saskatchewan is very short and everyone comes out to the lake to enjoy themselves. We aren't trying to ruin your fun. Enjoy yourselves, but play responsibly and please ensure that your children do the same. No one wants to see our children hurt.

We encourage all of you to report anyone you see, child or adult, who is not abiding by the rules of the road.
